

Service training to focus on elder abuse

Break the Silence, an annual conference hosted by Community Legal Aid, will take place on Thursday, March 16th from 9:00 a.m. - 4:30 p.m. at the Kent State University Hotel and Conference Center, 215 S. Depeyster St. in Kent, Ohio.

This year's conference will focus on serving individuals who experience abuse later in life and explore the connection between domestic, sexual assault, and elder abuse.

According to the National Council on Aging, approximately one in 10 people age 60 or older experience elder abuse. Survivors of abuse later in life experience abuse, neglect, abandonment, or financial exploitation by someone in an ongoing, trust-based relationship.

"When working with victims who are older adults, it's important to understand nuances between domestic violence and elder abuse," explained Jeanne Charles, managing attorney for Community Legal Aid's Legal Assistance to Victims Project. Charles added that making the distinction between the type of abuse will determine what types of services are best suited to meet a survivor's needs.

Sylvia Pla-Raith, Lead Staff of the Ohio Attorney General Elder Abuse Commission and Director of the Elder Justice Unit, Consumer Protection Section, is a featured speaker for the training. Pla-Raith will present on the intersection of intimate partner violence in later life and elder abuse and civil protection orders versus protective services orders.

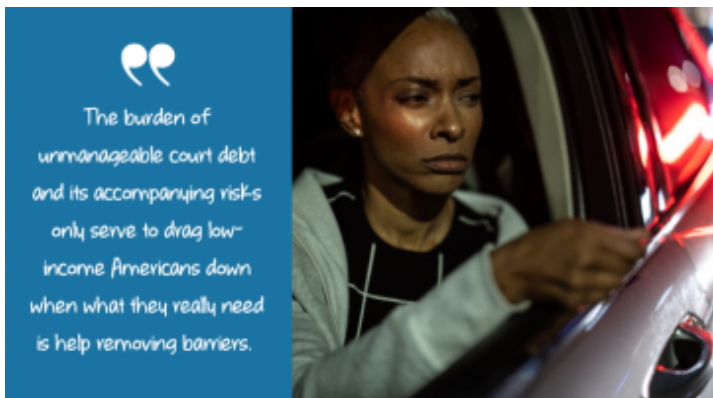
